

GETTING TO, AND AROUND, IN THE WINDY CITY IS A BREEZE ~ TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION ~

Chicago, the largest city in the Midwest, lies in the heart of the U.S. That makes getting here a breeze, no matter how you like to travel. Once here, it's easy and inexpensive to get around. The conference hotel, <u>Loews Chicago</u>, is right on the lake and river (entertainment district) and four blocks from a subway stop. The city is very walkable, and there is the <u>Divvy bike-share</u> program and 8 subway lines and 129 bus routes.

By Plane

There are two conveniently located international airports, <u>Chicago O'Hare (ORD)</u> and <u>Midway (MDW)</u>, 16 and 11 miles from downtown, respectively. Most carriers fly to ORD, and it's a hub for United and American. MDW is especially good for low-cost carriers. Both airports are on subway lines (CTA; known as "the L").

- Chicago Transit Authority (L trains, buses)
- GO Airport Express shared ride services to downtown and suburbs
- Taxi, Lyft, and Uber pick-up points are available at both airports

By Car

Chicago's central location and its position as a hub for the nation's major interstates make it a convenient drive from anywhere in the country. It is accessible via several major interstates and highways: I-90, I-94, I-55, I-290, and I-294. Find average drive times to Chicago.

- Hotel self-parking is \$46/night with in-and-out privileges.
- View an <u>interactive parking map of downtown Chicago</u> to search for nearby public parking lots and garages which may be more economical. If you want to pay for parking in advance, compare price, location, and amenities and reserve a spot with companies such as ABM Parking, iParkit, Millennium Garages, and SpotHero.

By Bus

<u>Greyhound</u> – five Chicagoland locations, including two 24-hour stations and 20 express routes to major U.S. cities <u>Megabus</u> – budget-friendly, city-to-city service South Shore Line – serves Chicago through northern Indiana to South Bend airport

By Train

Chicago's iconic Union Station services both Amtrak and Metra, the city's commuter rail service.
