The Senior Manager for Evaluation and Research provides expertise, leadership, and management for organizational data collection and evaluation. This position reports to the Chief Program Officer.

Key Responsibilities

- 1. Advise executive team on organizational data and evaluation needs, opportunities, and strategies.
- 2. Provide oversight of organizational data collection and evaluation.
- 3. Work in lockstep with Senior Manager of Program Monitoring and Evaluation and Senior Manager of Data and Technology to ensure efficient, effective, and cost-effective data and evaluation practices.
- 4. Apply evaluation and public health theory to update organization's theory of change and program logic models.
- 5. Use a diversity, equity, and inclusion lens to ensure evaluation design, data collection, analysis, and reporting reflect the diversity of youth, adults, and communities involved in programs being evaluated.
- 6. Implement and update evaluation plans that include output and outcomes measures, formative and summative evaluation, and quantitative and qualitative methods. Collaborate with fund development staff on evaluation information in grant proposals.
- 7. Develop evaluation and impact reports and associated tools that demonstrate the organization's impact on child health and well-being.
- 8. Conduct small-scale reviews of literature, manage research projects and studies, and collaborate on peerreviewed journal articles.
- 9. Stay educated about evaluation research, best practices, and trends and professionally engaged in the evaluation field.

- 10. Collaborate with all departments and matrix teams to support data and evaluation best practices and application of findings. Provide technical assistance and guide data-driven inquiry and decision-making and continuous program improvement with national and field staff.
- 11. Conceptualize and advocate for innovative tools, plans, and processes that grow and enhance the organization's use of data, evaluation, and research.
- 12. Facilitate the organization's Research and Evaluation committee of external experts.
- 13. Represent the organization externally at meetings and conferences; serve as a spokesperson to current and prospective supporters, partners, funders, and other interested parties.
- 14. Other duties as assigned.

- Bachelor's degree with a minimum of 5-7 years' experience in data analysis, epidemiology, and/or program evaluation; master's degree preferred
- Experience leveraging peer-reviewed literature and program theory to inform theories of change, logic models, and strategy maps
- Experience with qualitative, quantitative, and mixed method data collection and analysis
- Experience supporting the full life cycle of survey research: design build, deploy, analyze, and report
- Experience with data visualization, drawing conclusions from findings, and communicating concepts to non-technical audiences
- Experience using relational databases (e.g., Salesforce), survey platforms (e.g., Survey Monkey), and statistical software (e.g., SPSS)
- Strong commitment to working with diverse and underserved communities
- Ability to travel about 5% of time
